Impact100 East Bay announced three grants are available in 2024 to non-profits in Alameda and Contra Costa Counties:

• IMPACT GRANT - \$100,000

• CHANGEMAKER GRANT - \$75,000

• COMMUNITY GRANT - \$34,000

Thanks to our 134 members and a special \$75,000 member funded Changemaker Grant, we will award \$209,000 to deserving non-profits in 2024! This brings our total grant awards over the past 8 years to over \$1million!!

Impact100 East Bay's goal is to provide high-impact, transformational grants to nonprofits and reach the unmet needs in our community. Impact100 is a collective giving organization, members donate \$1,000 annually and the money pooled to offer high dollar grants to fund non-profit project proposals. Grants are selected by member vote.

Since 2017, Impact100 East Bay has awarded \$847,000 to 12 previous grant recipients who can be found <u>here</u>. The Grants committee will begin the hard work to select this year's recipients. Letters of invitation were sent to over 200 East Bay



non-profits starting our grant process (note: applications are accepted from any non-profit serving Alameda or Contra Costa County).

Kathy Young, Founder and CEO of Tri-Valley Non-Profit Alliance, was our keynote speaker at our Big Reveal on February 13 at the Lafayette Library. She highlighted critical community needs and successful actions that non-profits are doing to address those needs, a very informative presentation as we start our grant cycle.

Additionally, Caitlyn Sly Executive Director off Meals on Wheels – Diablo, detailed the impact our 2022 Community Grant funding a Breakfast Bag Program for Seniors! The Grant provided over 45,000 meals to 105 Seniors in our area. The success of their pilot program has supported longer term, sustainable funding of the Breakfast Bag!
